## **Haunt your ride – GBUAHN to host Trunk or Treat event**

(BUFFALO, N.Y., October 17, 2018) - The Greater Buffalo United Accountable Healthcare Network (GBUAHN), and United Healthcare are hosting Halloween Trunk or Treat event on **Saturday, October 27, 2018 from 2:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. at the GBUAHN/Urban Family Practice parking lot, 1315 Jefferson Avenue (corner of Jefferson and East Utica) Buffalo, N.Y. 14208.** This event is free to the public.

If you've never heard of a "trunk or treat" event, this is not a trick! At trunk or treats, participants decorate their vehicles' trunks according to a theme, and wear a costume to match. Decorated trunks run the gamut from very scary Halloween-themes featuring mummies, spooky spiders or skeletons...to popular children's TV or movie characters. Children dressed in costumes walk through the parking lot where the event is held, stop at cars that have decorated trunks and receive candy. Trunk or Treat is a safe way to trick or treat and celebrate Halloween.

Team Concepts Auto will be decorating many of their cars especially for the event. Eligible individuals will also be able to sign up for a GBUAHN membership and/or United Healthcare insurance.
